

Activity Report 2023 WELTFILME e.V.

1. FILM FORWARD (FF)

As in the previous projects, eight films from Ghana, Sierra Leone and Liberia were translated into French and subtitled by our partner ATCNA (Association Togolaise du Cinéma Ambulant) for **FILM FORWARD (FF)**. The films were shown on social media between February and March 2023 and were viewed around 125,000 times on Meta alone. 2. LOOKING CLOSER (LC)

At the beginning of 2023, the films of **LOOKING CLOSER (LC)** were finalised and publicly screened in the West African partner countries from February 2023 - on mobile cinema tours (with around 29,000 viewers reached), on television and, from August 2023, also on social media. The 16 films were viewed over 500,000 times on Meta, Instagram and YouTube.

The films were shown at international film festivals and won several awards - including *Best Film Award SHORT LOOK* (Togo), Best Documentary at the *Emergence Film Festival* (Togo), Best Documentary at the *National Selection Clap Ivoire* 2023 (Ivory Coast), Best Fictional Short Film at the *Togolese National Cinema Week* (Togo), five awards at *Black International Cinema Berlin* etc.

One of the project goals was to promote and intensify cooperation between the West African partner organisations within the **Film Network West Africa (FNWA)**. A comprehensive Memorandum of Understanding was drawn up to set out how the cooperation - now and in the future - between <u>YMCA</u> <u>Ghana, SLADEA (Sierra Leone)</u>, <u>NAEAL (Liberia)</u>, <u>SJDM/UTG (Gambia)</u> and <u>ATCNA Togo</u> should look.

LC was meant to be a preparation for the three-year project **MOVING BEYOND (MB)**. In order to apply for MB, it was necessary to have LC and the predecessor projects evaluated (ANNEX 1). The funding for the evaluation was already applied for in 2022 and finally carried out f by the Ghanaian market and social research agency Marketing and Consumer Insights LTD (MCI) rom January to March 2023. **The pleasing result:** LC (as well as the previous projects) and the associated measures were considered relevant and sustainable, while the projects were also certified as highly effective and efficient.

3. MOVING BEYOND (MB)

The application for **MB** (project duration: August 2023 - April 2026 / ANNEXES 5-7) was approved in July 2023.



As part of the project, film trainings, film productions and screenings will be carried out to achieve sustainable independence for the project partners. The aim is for YMCA Ghana, SLADEA, NAEAL, SJDM/ UTG and ATCNA Togo to be better equipped in terms of personnel and technology, to be more closely connected locally/nationally and to establish stable structures so that they can continue or expand their film programs independently and sustainably after the end of the project.

In addition, the following joint activities have taken place and continue to take place:

• FNWA meetings with the project leaders and managers:

At these online meetings, the partners advise each other on the implementation of measures and the achievement of objectives. In addition, ways of sustainably expanding cooperation between the partner organisations are discussed.

FilmConnect lecture series:

At this online event, which is organised alternately by the project partners, experts and/or trainers speak on various relevant topics of filmmaking: How can I professionalise myself and successfully establish myself in the film and media sector? How important is it to specialise within the various film departments? What is it like to work in the film industry as a woman? Etc.

• Masterclass in Media for Peace (M4P) implemented by Xchange Perspectives e.V.:

In order to strengthen and expand teaching in the subject of **Media for Peace (M4P)**, a **masterclass** was held in Ghana in November 2023, in which two trainers from each partner country took part. The trainers were trained by Felix Hoch from Xchange Perspectives e.V. WELTFILME has been working with Xchange Perspectives for over 10 years. 4. DIGITAL FILM SCHOOL AFRICA (DFSA)

WELTFILME has been the project sponsor of **DIGITAL FILM SCHOOL AFRICA (DFSA)** since 2022. DFSA is a project of YMCA Ghana and African University College of Communications (AUCC/Ghana) in cooperation with WELTFILME e.V. and the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH and is funded by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ).

During the project phase 3 (DF3), the most important achievements are:

- The curricula and modules 4-8 of the Beginner Courses for *Screenwriting, Documentary Film* and *Creative Producing* were developed. The complete courses (modules 1-8) were then taught at YMCA Ghana and AUCC by trained e-trainers.
- E-trainers were trained and a system for a sustainable Training of E-Trainers (TteT) developed
- Instructional videos were produced for the courses *Screenwriting*, *Documentary Film* and *Creative Producing*
- Concepts and Curricula as well as a first initial module for for the courses *Cinematography, Sound* and *Editing* were produced
- The structure and statutes of a legal association was developed so that DFSA, as an independent legal entity, can sustainably develop and manage the courses in the future and make them available to other teaching institutions
- DFSA opened with a high-profile launch in Accra.



The project was scheduled to end in June 2023, but phase 3 was extended by three months (up to and including September 2023). This was to ensure that the modules on the teaching platform atingi.com would be adjusted and improved after evaluating the feedback of course developers, course instructors and learners going through the first round of teaching.

The final report (ANNEX 8) was submitted in fall 2023. GIZ has not been able to close the financial side of the project up to now. Thus, we will have to share the financial documentation next year.

11. SUCCESS STORIES

For some trainers and trainees who have been trained in WELTFILME projects, 2023 was a very successful year. Below is a selection of their individual success stories:

Ghana:

Goddy Nana Mensah has produced and released his first feature film. SESIME was screened in Ghana at the National Theatre, NAFTI and the Goethe Institute in Accra, among others.

Sierra Leone:

The film CLASHOFERA, which was produced by Schwarbu E. Kamara and Zachariah Lloyd Sesay among others, has won several awards.

Zachariah Lloyd Sesay has found a producer in South Africa for his screenplay THE PATH OF RUGANZU.

Liberia:

Luther N. Mafalleh was nominated for Film Director of the Year at the Liberia Film Awards.

Joseph F. Doe was named best film editor at the Liberia Film Awards. His short documentary FISHING FOR LIFE (Project FF) has won several awards.

All four of LC's productions were nominated for Best Short Fiction or Best Documentary at the Liberia Film Awards. The film GIFTED VOICE won in the category "Best Short Fiction Film of the Year".

Gambia:

In addition to the SJDM/UTG training program, Salieu Jallow, former trainer, held a film workshop.

Togo:

LC's productions have won several awards. LITTLE TINKERER won Best Documentary at Clap Ivoire 2023, while A TICKET FOR EUROPE was awarded Best Short Film at the Togolese National Cinema Week and the Grand Public Festival in Lomé (Togo).

Ghana:

Goddy Nana Mensah produced and published his first feature film. Among other venues, SESIME was screened in Ghana at the National Theatre, at NAFTI film school and at the Goethe Institut Accra.
